Former Baltimore prosecutor, Assistant Attorney General for the State of Maryland, and trial attorney, Debbie Hines is an advocate for racial equity in the criminal justice system. An outspoken critic on criminal justice and race issues, Hines is often called on by media networks for legal commentary on local, national, and international outlets. Hines's opinion pieces appear in *The Washington Post*, *The Baltimore Sun*, thehill.com, and HuffPost.



Her book *Get Off My Neck: Black Lives, White Justice* and a Former Prosecutor's Quest for Reform (MIT Press) will be released on March 26, 2024, and is available now for pre-order.

She holds a Juris Doctorate from George Washington University Law School and a Bachelor of Arts degree in US history from the University of Pennsylvania. Debbie resides in Baltimore,
