An outspoken critic on criminal justice and race issues, Hines is often called on by media networks for legal commentary on local, national, and international outlets. Hines's opinion pieces appear in *The Washington Post*, *The Baltimore Sun*, thehill.com, and HuffPost.

Her book **Get Off My Neck: Black Lives, White Justice and a Former Prosecutor's Quest for Reform** (MIT Press) will be released on March 26, 2024, and is available now for pre-order.
