YOM HA SHOAH SILENT REMEMBRANCE

POSTLUDE

Jews around the world paused for Yom Ha Shoah on April 27th, a day commemorating what we call the Holocaust. Shoah means literally "catastrophe." We light a candle because anytime life is annihilated we are all diminished. This light reminds us that we hold both the responsibility and privilege to live lives that work in pursuit of justice for all—but especially for those who are marginalized and oppressed. We work for those whose stories we have not yet heard enough to

change our hearts and our way of living. These words scratched into a wall in Auschwitz remind us to listen further still that we might remember: <i>I believe in the sun even when it's not shining.</i> <i>I believe in love even when I don't feel it.</i> <i>I believe in God even whensilent.</i>
