Farewell to the Redbud at Metropolitan Memorial

As many have noticed, the Forest Pansy redbud tree outside the parking lot/office entrance is in decline. An arborist assessed the tree last year and said it could not be saved. Over the next few months the tree will be removed, the ground will lay fallow for a period, and a new tree will be put in its place. The cause of decline is not clear, but redbuds are understory trees that prefer shade. They also tend to be shorter-lived trees – about 25 years.
